Launching a collection of creative writing by City of Rockingham residents, representing the Australian of the Year Alumni as guest speaker for the Australia Day Council, addressing Lifeline, Crisis Support Volunteers and the Fairhaven Rebuilding Centre in Volunteers Week. I was also privileged to be sent by one of three committees on which I serve, to the Animal Ethics Conference in Hobart, a great opportunity to hear from and interact with leading researchers across Australia and New Zealand. I've now been invited to join a second human research ethics committee as the law requires a "person who performs a pastoral care role in a community" to be present. A pastor being given the opportunity to speak into the international work of two leading university research centres is an exciting honour. Recently I attended the 98five Foundation Supporters function and spoke on "The Power of Radio". Having seen the first test transmission of Sonshine FM and officially launched the station, I was delighted to learn it now has 163,000 regular listeners.

We thank God for a blessed time with Allan and Helen Meyer. I was so impacted by their energy and passion to share what they have learnt over many years, to help others and to help us as a church to help others. We are aware that much of what was shared raised further conversations so we are praying, "What next Lord?" I think we probably all particularly resonated with Allan's Sunday AM message about the Good Samaritan. If you were not there or couldn't attend the other sessions.
